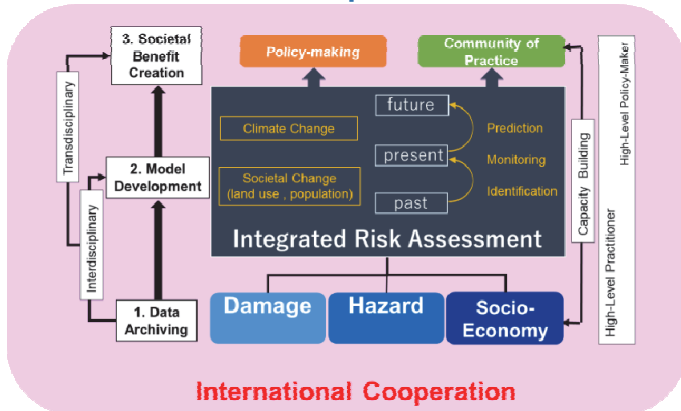

IFI Platform Concept

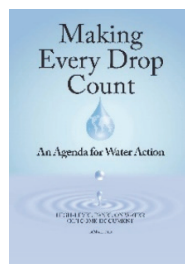


Conceptual Structure of Platform on Water Resilience and Disasters

The platform formulation started after the Implementation Workshop in January 2017 and the Jakarta Statement in November 2016. The platform connects the demand for sound, timely decisions and actions made by policy-makers and local communities with the provision of disaster risk information generated from integrated risk assessment and risk change identification. The platform also strengthens stakeholders' risk management capabilities and promotes the active use of interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary approaches. The platform activities are currently underway in Myanmar, Pakistan, the Philippines, and Sri Lanka.

HLPW Outcome Document

The High-Level Panel on Water (HLPW), convened by the UN Secretary-General and the President of World Bank Group, released their outcome document, "Making Every Drop Count," in March 2018, which stresses that Platforms on Water Resilience and Disasters among all stakeholders should be formulated in countries.

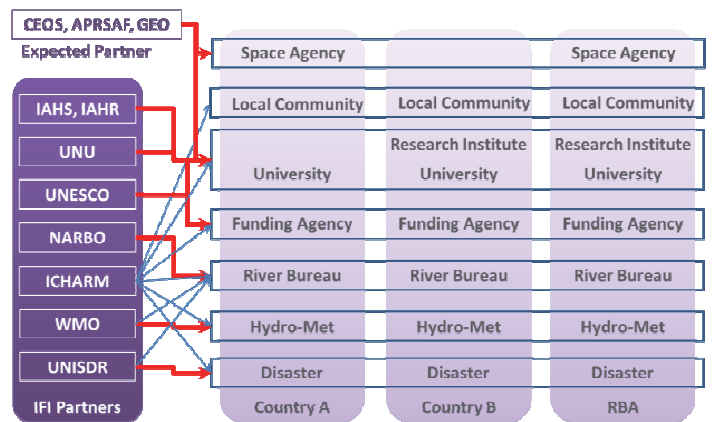
